Dear Abatement Applicant,

It is now after the September 1 deadline to file an abatement application for 2019. You will now need to complete, in addition to the application, the enclosed "PETITION TO BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO EXTEND DEADLINE TO FILE ARMED FORCES EXEMPTION APPLICATION". This exemption can be applied for until September 1, 2020. Please see the back of the Petition for the instructions. This form will need to be returned with the application and all required documents. Once it is returned, the Petition will then be reviewed by a review committee. Please be aware this review process takes a while as the Board of Commissioners are required to vote on the acceptance of the late application before it can be approved.

### INSTRUCTIONS

1. This Petition is to be used to request an extension of the deadline to file a blind abatement application after the filing deadline has passed.
2. This Petition is simply to determine if the Board of Commissioners will extend the deadline to file the abatement request since the abatement application was not filed within the required time.
3. This Petition will generally be denied if the Board of Commissioners finds there was no fault of the County or no extraordinary circumstances preventing the owner from filing an application for abatement before the deadline.
4. This Petition, when completed, should be filed with the Utah County Auditor's Office, 111 S University Avenue, Provo, Utah 84606.
5. The Affidavit of Circumstances portion of this form should provide a detailed explanation of the reasons why you believe the Board of Commissioners should extend the deadline, even though the application was not filed before the deadline. Specific facts should be provided to show **why you did not or could not file** the application for abatement before the deadline. Attach any supporting information that may provide proof relevant to your request.
