JOB SUMMARY:

Conducts sanitation inspections of eating establishments, commercial facilities, and public buildings, and inspects onsite sewage disposal systems and water systems to determine compliance with ordinances and laws designed to protect the health and safety of the public. Responds to and investigates complaints related to public health. Conducts public education training related to environmental health.

DUTIES INCLUDE:

Inspects food establishments in assigned areas using established protocol; inspects temporary food establishments and temporary mass gatherings as assigned; issues written orders and/or closes establishments for non-compliance as needed. **Collects** bacteriological samples for laboratory analyses from public swimming pools in assigned geographic areas; determines pH and disinfectant levels for compliance; performs physical inspections of public pools under the direction of the Environmental Health Program Manager.

Inspects school facilities, tanning salons, body art facilities, and used oil collection sites for sanitation and health code compliance.

Receives instruction from Environmental Health Program Managers concerning plan reviews for food establishments and public pools; performs pre-opening inspections under the direction of the Program Manager.

Responds to, and investigates complaints as assigned by a Bureau Director-Environmental Health.

EVALUATION AND SELECTION FACTORS INCLUDE:
