JOB SUMMARY: Conducts sanitation inspections of eating establishments, commercial facilities, and public buildings, and inspects onsite sewage disposal systems and water systems to determine compliance with ordinances and laws designed to protect the health and safety of the public. Responds to and investigates complaints related to public health. Conducts public education training related to environmental health. *Environmental Health Scientist I:* Incumbents in this working level perform under the general direction of a Bureau Director-Environmental Health. They independently perform much of the work.

DUTIES INCLUDE: Performs physical inspections of public pools; provides ongoing consultation with owners and operators regarding public pool water chemistry and water quality.

Performs onsite evaluations to determine the suitability for onsite wastewater disposal systems; performs soil evaluations to determine United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) soil classifications; reviews and approves third party designs of onsite wastewater disposal systems.

Conducts loan clearance investigations to determine functionality of existing onsite wastewater systems and drinking water quality.

Assists Environmental Health Program Managers in performing plan reviews for food establishments and public pools; performs pre-opening inspections in coordination with the Environmental Health Program Manager.

Provides consultations on the installation of septic systems and inspects the same for correct installation, proper use of materials, and layout.



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Performs Underground Storage Tank (UST) inspections including installation, closure, and leak inspections of active and inactive sites.

Collects water samples from private wells to determine compliance with drinking water standards.

Performs sanitary surveys of public drinking water systems to determine compliance with public drinking water standards; prepares and submits public water system reports and recommends improvements and repairs.

Represents the Health Department on various committees and boards.

Understands, and represents the Health Department in, enforcement of environmental health rules and regulations.
