3. Annual Storm Water Reports are due on October 1, 2014. Glen Tanner sent out to each City the updated City information. If you did not receive it, please contact him by email. If there are some Cities that need an extension, contact Nestor Gallo and he will present this to USWAC in hopes to prevent a City from receiving a fine.
4. Interlocal Agreement copies can be emailed to each coalition member. If there are any in need of another copy, request one by emailing Glen Tanner.
5. Annual APWA Conference is scheduled for September 30 and October 1, 2014 at the South Towne Expo Center. Registration information has been emailed to all Coalition members. The link is <http://utah.apwa.net>. New Storm Water Coalition City members are invited to meet with Nestor Gallo the day prior to the conference for assistance if you need help with reports.
6. RSI training and certification is scheduled for September 29, 2014 scheduled through the APWA web site. The Coalition will send 2-3 individuals. The elected attendees at this point are Ryan Peterson and Ryan Johnson.
7. There is a need for a new USWAC representative to represent the Storm Water Coalition. This coming year will be an important year regarding storm water policies and procedures. It is important that the new representative be alert to speak up in regards to policy and procedures that will be implemented. Policies implemented can lead to legal ramifications later if the policy is not followed closely by each City. An important aspect of this position will be communication between what has been discussed at the USWAC meetings and conveying that to the Coalition. Volunteers for nominees spoke up to present themselves for the position. Jonathan Saluone from Provo City volunteered to represent the Coalition. Glen Tanner will send an email out with his contact information. Contact Glen Tanner with any questions.
8. New Construction General Permit training classes will be scheduled in the future. The information will be sent out via email to all members.
9. Discussion on Excal videos – new training video titled “SPCC Oil & Water – Do NOT Mix”. Cost \$510. Also, discussion on IDDE – a grate concern (Public Outreach) License Agreement for access to video feed that can be put on community television, video feed during fairs or celebrations, etc. Cost is \$3,265.00 for all coalition members based on population of participating cities. Contact Glen Tanner if you are interested in purchasing this program. Contact Glen if you wish to have the company send a free sample video.
10. It has been five years since the last Market Research Study that was done by BYU for monitoring Storm Water Awareness. It was presented to the Coalition once again to have BYU follow up with a new study. The Coalition approved to have a study done. The cost of the study is around \$5000.00. Other bids will be gathered from other sources like UVU. It is expected the BYU cost will come in less expensive since they have done the study in the past and already have a template setup for the study. The question came up as to what survey questions would be asked on the study. It was presented to the Coalition to send to Glen any lists of questions they would prefer to have on the survey. Each City will receive a CD and Booklet with the final statistics of awareness.

Glen Tanner reported that awareness among the fourth graders in school has increased. Calls have come into the County from parents asking how to dispose of the oil from their cars explaining that their child had learned in school oil has to be discarded in proper receptacles. This has shown that the storm water outreach programs are working and now perhaps more focus should be placed on the higher grades of older students.

A question was discussed regarding using advertising on the vehicles that City or Public works use to help inform the public about the awareness about only "Rain in the Drain". This will be reviewed so that all the designs are copy right protected and unified in the whole state.

12. State Storm Water Meeting USWAC

14. Other Business
Discussion regarding the Storm Water General Plan Permit will be expiring this next year. Every five years it is reviewed and a new draft is adopted. Division of Water Quality creates a draft. The new draft goes out for public notice for thirty days. Comments are received and reviewed. Revisions are made. The draft goes out for public comment again for thirty days. The process continues until all revisions are completed and there are no more comments. At that point, the Permit is approved. The last General Plan Permit was presented in 2008 and adopted in 2010. It was agreed that as a body the Coalition would go over the permit to review the new permit presented to make needed comments and send it to USWAC as a coalition.
