### Welcome Baby and Home Visitation

"Welcome Baby" is a home visitation program for pregnant women and their children from birth to 5 years of age. It is a "Success By Six" program cosponsored with United Way of Utah County. Health, vision, hearing, and nutritional assessments are performed by registered nurses, trained volunteers, and Spanish speaking paraprofessionals. Information is available on developmental milestones, infant cues and states, brain development, parent-child relationship, safety, trust, attachment and discipline.

### Children's Special Health Care Needs (CSHCN)

Provides diagnostic and treatment services to children ages 0-18 years of age that have a disability. Occupational and physical therapists as well as specialists in the areas of orthopedics, neurology, cardiology, audiology, speech, psychology and nutrition provide services at the specialty clinics.




