- 2. Whenever possible, seek medical treatment first at our preferred Medical Provider, WorkMed

4. Report your injury to your supervisor immediately, so they can complete the Workers' Compensation Supervisor's Report and email the form to Karen Allen email: <u>karena@utahcounty.gov</u> phone: 801-851-8159.

- 5. Complete the form First Report of Injury Workers' Compensation and submit to Human Resources.
- 6. If you are missing more than 5 consecutive days, be sure to request FMLA at fmla@utahcounty.gov
- 7. Follow your doctor's instructions.
- 8. Keep your Supervisor informed of your progress.
- 9. When your physical restrictions change, notify your claim adjuster immediately 800-227-1538.

10. Give your work restrictions/return to work documentation from your doctor to Human Resources and your supervisor before returning to work.

11. Be sure you maintain contact with your claims adjuster 800-227-1538.

Please Note:

- Please submit the required forms in a complete and timely manner so that a decision on your Workers' Compensation claim can be made promptly.
- No workers compensation benefit is paid for the first three days after an injury or illness unless the disability prevents an employee from working for more than a total of 14 days.
