

Storm Water Coalition Minutes
June 23, 2011

1. Welcome and Roll

2. Storm Water Instructor update

Jenny was able to contact all the schools on the list with the exception of about 3 or 4 schools that declined to have the presentation. Glen will contact the Coalition members for these schools to see what can be done to have them seen next year. Members were asked to review the list that will be published to make updates for schools. This should be published for review in July.

It has been reported a fifth grade teacher inquired as to how she could have the presentation given to her fifth grade class. Scout Troops have requested Jenny to give the Storm Water presentation to their groups. The presentation is being received well.

It is her goal to have the list of schools with scheduled presentation dates to present to the coalition members prior to the next school year so when school starts she is ready.

3. Sub-committees Updates

A. Inspection Committee - Ryan Johnson(Orem-City), Juan Garrido(Springville City), Don Overson(Vineyard City), Mark Atwood(Pleasant Grove City), Scott Allen(Provo City), Jeff Maag(Cedar Hills City)

1. ComplianceGo Program

This program has been purchased for a six (6) month trial period for all coalition municipalities to test. Should they agree to continue to use the program, the price of the program will be offered to the coalition by the creators. Coalition members are encouraged to take the time to setup an account and use the system during this time. The trial fee is \$500.00 dollars a month.

Training sessions as a coalition or for each member can be setup. An email will be sent with the links for the coalition members to log on and setup their user accounts. Registration will be in the month of July. Starting up for coalition to begin using the program is scheduled for the month of August.

2. State inspection forms

The state has accepted various forms from other municipalities. The hope is that everyone will be using the same forms to make it as simple as possible for the State to gather all the information and reports.

B. Education committee - Steve Johnson(Orem City), Glen Tanner(Utah County Public Works), Paul Miller(Lindon City)

1. Promotional Items

Promotional items have been purchased for cities to handout during their city festivals this summer. Allotments based on how much each city pays and population. A number of different items for distribution have been ordered. Springville City, Orem City, Cedar Hills City, were able to handout to many of their residents. Contact Glen prior to your celebrations or festivals. They can be picked up at Public Works.

Paul Miller appreciated the water bottle carabineers. Plastic water bottles are found many times clogging up the storm drains. They were thinking if more

people used the clip on water bottle attachments, they can hold on to them better until they reach a trash receptacle.

C. Discharge Committee - Nestor Gallo(American Fork City), Stan Orme(Orem City), Rustin Porter(Springville City), Don Renyolds(ACCENA Group)

1. A power point has been created to assist the committee regarding understanding legal explanations and issues for the reporting. They will present the power point at the next storm water meeting.

D. Post Construction Committee - Trapper Burdick(Spanish Fork City), Rick Sabey(Orem City), Curtis Chatwin(Lehi City), Juan Garrido(Springville City)

4. State Storm Water program updates

The permit database is up and running. Members may still encounter some glitches. It is ready for members to create their accounts and should be online. If you encounter difficulties, contact Harry Campbell. At the next meeting, an account will be created for all to see how to get started.

To terminate permits, contact Harry Campbell's office and they can assist members to clean up your list of old permits. They want to verify that those projects have been stabilized.

NOI will have a charge. Some projects will show pending. If they are from the last couple of months back, contact Campbell's office to discuss those project so that they do not get charged.

Industrial Permits are covered under the MS4 permits. Contact Campbell's office to terminate the permits. This excludes sewer treatment plants, land fills, transportation and sector P.

Rhonda is working on the new Salt Lake County permit. When this has been completed she will again focus on audits. They will be checking back to make sure all corrections have been made. A question had arose regarding the fines the were imposed and the need to spend money on a storm water coalition program. It will be expected now that fines will be enforced. The cities are encouraged to support their storm water coalition members. A list has been compiled by the State of cities that they believe have not been doing what they need to comply with State standards. Action will be taken soon. Some fines are estimated to be around \$100,000.00.

NEP areas have grown considerably. A new NEP map will be published soon.

5. Other Business

Flooding conditions in Utah County areas were discussed. Pre snow fall preparations have shown to be very helpful to keep the creeks and rivers flowing.

EPA

American Fork City has been visited by the EPA. The EPA is visiting cities in regards to industrial activity. Fines are being issued. Cities are encouraged to follow through on issuing citations. Members are encouraged to take immediate action to make sure industries in their areas are complying with EPA and State standards. If these entities do not comply, it is recommended to shut them down until they do comply. American Fork

City was spared a citation and fines due to their quick action regarding the issue. Suggested that pictures and good documentation be kept not only to prosecute non-compliance entities but also to protect the city and coalition member by proving they have done all that is necessary to make sure the company is in compliance.

EPA will be attending the region 8 Expo training.

A residence disposal flyer to distribute will be created and sent out.

The next scheduled meeting will be Thursday, August 25, 2011, 10 A.M at the Public Works Building.
