

Declaration of Candidacy Information for 2024 Elections

Candidate Filing

Candidate Filing is January 2, 2024, at 8:00am through January 8, 2024, at 5:00pm

- Candidate filings must occur in person
- Statewide and federal candidates must file at the Lt. Governor's Office
- Multicounty candidates (legislative districts that are split between counties) may file at the county clerk's office where they reside or at the Lt. Governor's Office
- Candidates for Utah County's countywide races must file at the Utah County Clerk's Office
- Local School Board Candidates must file with the Utah County Clerk's Office
- Candidates with a qualified political party must file a declaration of candidacy in person between **January 2, 2024, at 8:00am and January 8, 2024, at 5:00pm.**
- Unaffiliated candidates must file a declaration of candidacy in person between **January 2, 2024, at 8:00am and March 5 at 5:00pm.**

Judges and Judicial Retention - Candidate filing period is July 1, 2024, at 8:00am through July 15, 2024, at 5:00pm.

- Supreme Court (one seat)
- Court of Appeals Judge (one seat)
- Juvenile Court (one seat)
- Justice Court (any whose term is expiring)

Candidate Nomination Petitions

Candidate Nomination Petitions

- Candidates can start filing intent to gather signatures as early as January 2, 2024, and turn signatures in no later than 14 days before the party convention.
- Candidates with a qualified political party must file a declaration of candidacy in person between **January 2, 2024, at 8:00am and January 8, 2024, at 5:00pm.**
- Unaffiliated candidates must file a declaration of candidacy in person between **January 2, 2024, at 8:00am and March 5 at 5:00pm.**

CANDIDATE INFORMATION

- Candidate petition packets will be processed in order that they are returned to the Clerk's Office.
- Candidates must gather a certain number of signatures based on the office they are filing for and the political party:
 - U.S. Senate 28,000
 - U.S. Congress 7,000
 - State Treasurer 28,000
 - Ut State Senate 2,000
 - Ut State House 1,000
 - State School Board By Party (see chart below)
 - County Offices By Party (see chart below)
 - Unaffiliate Candidates 300

Candidates eligible to be on the Primary Election Ballot:

- All Candidates who successfully gather the required number of signatures on their nomination petition
- Candidates that are certified through the Party Convention process

Closed Party Primaries – parties determine who is eligible to participate in their elections. In ‘Closed’ primaries, only voters that are registered with the party are eligible to vote in their party elections.

- **Party affiliation change deadline is January 9, 2024, at 5:00pm.** Anyone already registered with a political party cannot change their party affiliation at the polls on Election Day.
- Unaffiliated voters will be allowed to affiliate with a party at the polls.

Master Ballot Position List

Note: In accordance with Utah Code Section 20A-6-305, the Utah Lieutenant Governor establishes a randomization of the alphabet to create the **Master Ballot Position List**. The election officers use the master ballot position list to determine the order in which to list candidates on the ballot for any election held during 2024 through 2025.

The 2024-2025 Master Ballot Position List will be created on **January 9, 2024**, by the Utah Lieutenant Governor Deidre M. Henderson and will be posted on the State and Utah County websites on that date.
